This year, we had the privilege of hosting and participating several notable events. organized technical workshops and lectures on topics such as enhanced oil recovery, wellcompletion, and stimulation, featuring renowned speakers from the industry. 


# Membership

The delegation was led by Ms. Oghogho Effiom, SPE Africa Regional Director, and included Mr. Moyosore Olaoluwa Davies, SPE Regional Activities Manager for Europe and Africa, Dr. Riverson Oppong, SPE Ghana Section Director, and Ms. Samantha Vanessa Armstrong, SPE Member Programmes Senior Manager.

The delegation's visit included various activities to strengthen ties between **SPE** and Uganda's petroleum industry, such as the SPE Annual Student Technical Conference and Exhibition (SASTCE 2024), a trip to the oil and gas projects in the Albertine Graben, discussions with the CEO (Ms. Proscovia Nabbanja) and the leadership of the Uganda National Oil Company, and the SPE Networking Forum. It began with an elegant dinner where SPE Uganda Section Board members welcomed the quests.

# SPE Annual Student Technical Conference and Exhibition (SASTCE) 2024

The SASTCE 2024, held at Makerere University, was themed "Transformative Synergy with Advancing Technologies." The event brought together a diverse audience, including students from across Africa, representatives from over ten universities, as well as professionals and academicians in the petroleum and geology sectors, to engage in discussions on advancements and innovations in the field.

The event featured paper presentations, exhibitions, opportunities, and knowledge-sharing networking panels from experienced professionals from TotalEnergies E&P Uganda Limited, CNOOC Uganda, SLB, UNOC, Petroleum Authority of Uganda, Ministry of Energy and Mineral Development (MEMD), Uganda Chamber of Mines and Petroleum, G&G Skills, Barrel Magazine, GSU, Aldelia, and other sector players. Most importantly the event featured and hosted the SPE Africa Regional Paper Contest and the National and Regional SPE PetroBowl competition.

# National PetroBowl Competitions and Regional Competitions

The PetroBowl® competition is an annual quiz event where SPE student chapter teams compete in quick-fire rounds, answering both technical and non-technical industry-related questions. Since its debut in 2002, it has grown significantly in size and popularity, becoming a global event with regional qualifiers introduced in 2015.

The SASTCE 2024 witnessed enthusiastic participation from over eight universities in the regional and national PetroBowl competitions. In the national finals, the SPE Mbarara University Chapter triumphed over the SPE UPIK University Chapter, successfully defending their title as reigning champions. They advanced to represent Uganda in the regional qualifiers, where they competed fiercely and emerged as finalists alongside SPE Kenyatta University. Ultimately, they clinched victory, earning the honor of representing Africa in the PetroBowl International competition.

The PetroBowl International Competition takes place at the Annual Technical Conference and Exhibition (ATCE) in the USA annually.

Unfortunately, due to limited funds at the time, the triumphant team of the SPE Student Chapter of Mbarara University of Science and Technology did not travel to the PetroBowl International Competition.

### The SPE Africa Region Student Paper Contest

The SPE Student Paper Contest (SPC) is a premier competition designed to showcase the technical expertise of students at the undergraduate, master's, and PhD levels. Coordinated across 14 regions, students present their sole-authored technical papers, which are reviewed by a panel of judges through presentations and Q&A sessions.

The most innovative and well-researched papers from regional contests advance to the International Student Paper Contest. The contest is governed by the Young Member Engagement Committee (YMEC), which reports to the SPE International Board of Directors. For the first time, Uganda hosted the SPE Africa Region Student Paper Contest, and the winner was Alexander Ifenaike from the University of Ibadan, Nigeria, who was awarded by the Regional Director.

## **Exhibitions by Different Universities**

The exhibitions showcased the creative minds of university students in Uganda through innovative solutions to pressing issues. Kyambogo University received accolades for the best exhibition, presenting a new technology designed to test water purity, which can be integrated into various industries.

# Tour to the Albertine Grabben

The second activity for the delegation was a comprehensive tour of the Albertine region, known for its growing petroleum activities, from 23rd to 24th March 2024, accompanied by representatives from the Petroleum Authority of Uganda (PAU). The tour aimed to showcase the progress of Uganda's oil and gas projects and their coexistence with communities and wildlife.

On 23rd March 2024, the delegation visited the Kingfisher Development Area (KFDA) in Kikuube district, including Well Pad 3, the Buhuka Gravity Water Scheme, and the resettlement housing project. The delegates encouraged the PAU team to promote positive publications about the projects, highlighting community proximity, economic activities like the World Bank market in KFDA, and the reduction in footprint (30 well slots on a single pad).

The tour facilitated an immersive learning experience, enabling the delegates to glean valuable insights into Uganda's petroleum landscape while appreciating its socioeconomic implications. The delegates got to witness firsthand the coexistence of the oil and gas industry with the community and within the national park, which is unique to the oil and gas projects in Uganda.

The Kingfisher Development Area (KFDA) is Licensed to CNOOC Ug. Ltd and the Tilenga Area is Licensed to TotalEnergies E&P Ug. Ltd. The oil fields under the Tilenga project have a combined volume of oil in place of 5.8 billion barrels of oil (Bbbls) with recoverable resources estimated at 874MMbbls. And KFDA has 568MMbbls in place with recoverable resources estimated at 186MMbbls.

They also appreciated the extension of safe water to the KFDA communities near Lake Albert and the tremendous progress in Uganda's oil and gas sector, but they also committed to continuing to support the sector developments.

The SPE Networking Forum 2024, held at Four Points by Sheraton, Kampala, was attended by industry professionals, government officials, and academic leaders.

The forum served as a hub for knowledge sharing, professional networking, and strategic dialogue. It featured technical presentations, panel discussions, networking opportunities, and an awards and recognition session.

Mr. Kato Obadiah Anthony, the former Chairperson of the SPE Uganda Section highlighted that Uganda, as a young entrant in the sector, is in a strategic position to learn and implement efficient exploitation of its petroleum resources for the country's benefit based on lessons from countries whose sector has matured over time. He further stated that Uganda's petroleum industry will require professional individuals with robust competence in various technical disciplines to develop innovative solutions and demonstrate exceptional leadership capabilities to ensure that the energy needs of the country are met.

The forum featured a keynote address by Mr. Philips Obita, Chief Operating Officer of Upstream at the Uganda National Oil Company (UNOC). He discussed Uganda's global energy demand, future energy systems, the drive to decarbonize oil and gas projects, and strategies for SPE and the industry to meet Uganda's energy needs.

Mr. Moyosore Olaoluwa Davies discussed SPE's contributions to the energy industry in Africa and globally, highlighting benefits for both professional and student members. He encouraged members to maximize these benefits to enhance their competence in the oil and gas sector.

# Shaping the Future of Oil and Gas in Uganda: A Townhall Discussion

On 27th November 2024, the SPE Uganda Section hosted its second Professional Townhall, bringing together industry experts and young professionals to discuss the future of oil and gas in Uganda. The event, held at CNOOC Uganda Limited's head offices, provided a platform for stakeholders to share insights, exchange ideas, and explore opportunities for growth and development.

# How Oil and Gas Competencies are Shaping Low-Carbon Technologies

This lecture, delivered by Dr. Rita Esuru Okoroafor from Texas A&M University on 10th June 2024, focused on the relevance of low-carbon energy technologies, including renewable energy resources, carbon capture utilization and storage (CCUS), hydrogen, and fuel cells. # Taking Drilling Geomechanics to the Digital World and the Dynamic Drilling Environment


### By: Hussain I. AlBahrani, Ph.D

This lecture, delivered on 19th February 2024 by Hussain I. AlBahrani, Ph.D., a researcher at Saudi Aramco, shared groundbreaking research on the application of machine learning models (ANN and tree-based models) to assess wellbore damage. He discussed the innovative use of shale shakers equipped with cameras to capture vital data like size, color, and quantity of solid cuttings, which can infer the formation being drilled through. This technology has the potential to revolutionize industry practices. The lecture was held at Hotel Africana with over 80 professional participants, who engaged in discussions and knowledge sharing.


# Insights on preparing Technical papers for the upcoming Annual Technical Conference and Exhibition (ATCE)




